The One Who Sees Me

A little girl and her mom were on the subway in New York City amongst a crowd of other people. Suddenly, the little girl discovered that she had lost sight of her mom. In a panicked voice, she called out, "Mom, I can't see you! Are you still here?" The mom answered immediately and confidently, "I know you can't see me right now, sweetheart, but I can still see you. I promise, I won't let you out of my sight." The little girl then relaxed because she was reassured that the one she trusted the most in this world had her safely in her sight.

This story gives us a picture of how our patient and loving Father God offers us reassurance through His word that we are never out of His sight and He will always hear our cries for help. God is called by various names throughout scripture. People in the Bible gave some of those names while others are names He first called Himself. Each name describes a part of His character. In Genesis 16, we read about a woman named Hagar who was in distress and running from her masters. And God saw her! And when God met her in her distress, she said, You are the God who sees me, I have now seen the one who sees me (Genesis 16:13) The phrase "The God who sees me" is translated as El Roi in Hebrew. El Roi is the God who numbers the hairs on our heads. He counts our every tear. He knows every detail of our circumstances. Even the most attentive parent must sleep, but our Heavenly Father never closes his eyes to us. He never misses a detail of what is happening. He sees everything and knows what is to come.

So friends, how can we not trust such a God? How can we doubt Him if we know Him as El Roi? Can we have that deep trust that the one who loves us the most sees us all the time? We may be in situations where we want to panic because we feel like God's not seeing or hearing us, yet we can read in many different verses that He always sees and hears so let's cling to the truth that He sees us and let's be reassured by His Presence. When we trust Christ as our Savior and our eyes are opened in faith, we can clearly see God. Like Hagar, we can call out "I have now seen the one who sees me!"
